

81st Annual Meeting Minutes

Kelly Rhinehart, President, welcomed everyone to the 81st Annual Meeting, being the 2nd
Virtual Meeting, on December 6, 2021 at 7:06pm and introduced himself. Kelly Rhinehart proceeded
on welcoming all New Members from May 2020 – April 2021.

Kelly Rhinehart, President, called the meeting to order at 7:15 pm.

Kelly Haaksma congratulated the scholarship winners while thanking the parents and families for their continued support.

Kelly Rhinehart turned the meeting over to Kelly Haaksma, CEO, to give her report. Kelly spoke of how the construction of the New Jamestown Branch location is coming along. Sharing the information that the drive-thru lanes will be opening in a week while the lobby is expected to be opening in December/beginning of year.

Kelly Haaksma spoke of the effects of the Pandemic on many of our Fundraisers/
Promotions. Fortunately, we were still able to safely conduct our Sign and Win Super Bowl Pool,
Faceboook Post and Win, Youth Month, Youth Summer Stash, our Member CA\$Hpreciation Month
and Facebook Bingo. Just finishing the wrap up of our Member CA\$Hpreciation Month, we gave
away over \$3,000 in Cash Prizes to 31 members, 1 of the drawings being a Generation drawings
starting at 1950, and additional cash prizes special for Credit Union Week.

Kelly Haaksma spoke of supporting Chautauqua County. Throughout the year we supported multiple local fundraisers including selling \$5,000 in CASA Pinwheels for Prevention and donating gift baskets. 
Per our bylaws, the Board of Directors appointed a Nominating Committee. The Nominating Committee has selected four (4) candidates for four (4) open seats on the Board of Directors for the 2022-2023 year with 3 terms having a length of three years and 1 term having a length of one year. The full Nomination Letter is located on our website.

The Credit Union closed out the year with

- 9,613 in Total Members!
- \$81.8 million in Shares & Deposits!
- \$33 million in Loans!
- \$89.3 million in Assets!

- Earned \$3.8 million from Loans, Investments, and Fees
- Operating Expenses totaled approximately \$3 million
- \$27,600 was expensed out to cover Loan Losses
- GCFCU paid out \$266,995 to our members in Dividends

After all expenses and dividends were paid, our net income resulted in \$537,948.



The pie chart above shows the impact member borrowing has on the credit union's income. Loans account for 58% of our total income which is then returned to our members in the form of lower loan rates, dividends on savings, and outstanding products and services! The credit union continues to provide a safe, convenient place to save and borrow with competitive rates and personal service suited toward your specific needs.

Supervisory Committee Report

Supervisory Committee Report for the 82nd Annual Meeting

Our Supervisory Committee is composed of three dedicated individuals; Karen Bifaro, Marsha Butler and Dale Ricker, that act as an independent body to monitor and evaluate the state of the Credit Union's finances, operations and decisions. Following the NCUA guidelines, the Committee uses a defined Audit Plan and Operational Review to provide the Board of Directors with written assessments of the procedures applied. These assessments are independent of the internal reviews by employees. Our Branch On-Site duties include monthly surprise cash counts of teller drawers, vaults and ATM machines, scrutiny of over/short logs, and cash expenses. In addition we hold quarterly meetings, and we provide a Committee report to the Board of Directors monthly. We are required to personally conduct monthly verification of closed accounts, review of bank reconciliations, review of expenses for supplies and misc. expenses, wire transfers, and we personally respond to any member concerns or complaints. Every other year we are responsible for conducting a thorough Member Account Verification process.

At our quarterly Supervisory meetings we conduct reviews of File Maintenance reports, Dormant Account reports and Expense Account authorizations. We examine Financial Account reconciliations as well as Employee and Official (insider) accounts. During 2022 we conducted an in-depth member account verification through the Member Statement process. We reviewed all returned statements and used multiple processes to attempt to obtain correct addresses for all members whose statements were not deliverable as addressed. Members – please take note – it is your responsibility to update your correct address for any permanent or temporary change of address, phone number, or any other important personal information concerning your account.

Our Supervisory Committee contracted with a new CPA Audit firm this year to perform our Annual Agreed Upon Procedures Audit. We signed a 3 year contract with Gayle Schutte, CPA. This Annual audit occurs each year after our Financial yearly cycle date ending June 30th. We contract with FJP & Associates to do our Quarterly Audits as well as the required ACH and BSA Audits. Most of the audit work is now being done virtually and our Credit Union Management team have learned to make this an efficient and accurate process, which as a sideline, manages to decrease the expenses incurred for completing these audits. Our committee reviews all of the Audit reports, meets with Auditors and NCUA Examiners for their summary reports, and we report back to the Board of Directors about all processes involved.


